Практический фонетический курс от букв и буквосочетаний к звукам подходит к любым учебным пособиям отечественных и зарубежных издательств, как к разговорным курсам, так и к программам для школьников начального и элементарного уровня, может использоваться как самоучитель.

Курс состоит из 24 уроков. Цель курса – знакомство с фонетической системой английского языка, транскрипционными знаками, постановка звуков и тренировка правил чтения. Выбор слов в заданиях обусловлен основными лексическими темами (знакомство, семья, дом и т.п.). Фонетический урок можно выбирать как для устного опережения, так и на повторение уже пройденной ранее темы, а также с целью обогащения пассивного словарного запаса.

Учебный материал представлен в простых схемах с примерами, в упражнениях тренируется произношение звуков в словах, фразах, рифмовках, пословицах, поговорках и стихах. Фонетическая зарядка занимает не более 5 минут. Аудиозапись к курсу сделана в паузах для возможности повторения за диктором.
