In Scotland, New Year's Day is on the first of January, but the big New Year's party is on the 31st of December. 'Hogmanay' is the Scottish name for this party. 


Wallace and Gromit

This is Wallace. He's famous in England. He's the star of some great English animated cartoon films, videos and comic books.


Gromit is Wallace's pet dog. He's the other star of the famous animated cartoon films. They live in a small town in the north of England, and they are both very funny.

Today the Tower of London is a museum, but five hundred years ago it was a prison. Many famous people from British history were in prison there.

Lady Jane Grey is one example, and her ghost still appears in the Tower of London today. Five hundred years ago, Lady Jane was the Queen of England ... but for only nine days. She was a prisoner in the Tower for a long time.

One cold night in February 1957, two museum guards were at work in the Tower of London. Suddenly there was a young woman near them. She had a long white dress, and long golden hair - Lady Jane Grey had long golden hair too.

- Another prisoner in the Tower for many years was Sir Walter Raleigh. He was a great English explorer, writer and scientist four hundred years ago.

It was a windy night in February 1983. One of the guards at the Tower of London was in the guardroom. Suddenly there was a noise at the door, and a tall man was there in the shadows. He had the same old-fashioned clothes as the man in a picture in the Tower of London museum - a picture of Sir Walter Raleigh!



Another famous ghost sometimes appears at a great London church, St Paul's Cathedral. Many people have stories about seeing him. The ghost is an old man with long grey hair, and old-fashioned clothes. He always walks slowly across the same part of the church, and he always disappears into the same part of one wall! Who was this old man? It's a mystery.



There is another ghost mystery at the Theatre Royal, a very old London theatre. This ghost is a young man in old-fashioned English clothes. He always appears at the same time of day, and he always sits in the same place in the theatre. After five minutes, he stands up, walks across the theatre, and disappears into a wall!

Why does this ghost come back again and again? And why does he always sit in that place in this famous old theatre? It's another London ghost mystery.
