Protect the kangaroo, the koala and the beaver¹! The kangaroo and the koala are the symbols of Australia. The beaver is a symbol of Canada.



The koala lives in Australia, too. It is grey or brown. It has got big funny ears and a big black nose. The koala is very lazy. It sleeps a lot. It likes healthy food and eats green leaves¹ from trees. It gets water from the leaves.


