I was a teenager when I went to India for the first time. I spent three weeks there with my family and it was definitely one of the best experiences of my life.



The Pigeon Post



Nowadays, we have the Internet and the telephone. So, we are able to communicate with people instantly, no matter how far away they are. But it wasn't always this easy. In the past, people had other ways of getting their messages across. For example, some used people (known as messengers) while others used animals. One of the most common ways was to use carrier pigeons.

Many people don't know it, but carrier pigeons were the first 'airmail system' in the world. You can write a message on a piece of paper, put it in a small tube and attach it to the pigeon's leg. The pigeons can take the message anywhere and then fly back with a reply. They can fly great distances without

getting tired. Also, they can travel day and night and always find their way back home.

The ancient Egyptians and Persians used this kind of communication over 3000 years ago to deliver important news. Later on, the Greeks used the birds to carry news of the Olympic games, such as the names of winning athletes, to different parts of the country. The Romans and many others sent military information using pigeons.

In modern times, people used carrier pigeons for various reasons, too. During the Franco-Prussian war (1870-1871), when Paris was under attack, carrier pigeons helped to send messages to and from the city. During WWI and WWII, some pigeons even got medals because they saved lives. In the 20th century, they used carrier pigeons in some places in India to send messages with news of natural disasters.

It was the 5th century BC in Athens, Greece. A group of people were having dinner in a small building. Suddenly, a boy came into the room with a message for one of the men, Simonides of Ceos. Simonides stood up and walked outside. As soon as he left, the building collapsed. All of the people who were inside died.

People soon arrived at the scene of the accident. They were worried about their loved ones and began asking Simonides questions, "Who was in there? How many people?" At first, he couldn't answer their questions. Later, he was able to remember almost every person. How? By remembering everyone's location, or where they were sitting around the table.

Simonides later developed a method for remembering things. He based his method on his experience of visualising locations in a room. People still use this method today, and it's often called the Method of Loci.

The Method of Loci is one of the systems used in mnemonics, or 'the art of memory'. Studying mnemonics helps you remember names, dates, numbers, events, etc. The great mnemonic artist of present times, Dominic O'Brien, uses the Method of Loci in his own way. He is able to memorise historical facts and geographical places very easily. For this reason, he has won the World Memory Championship eight times. This competition takes place every year and competitors try to remember as much information as possible within a certain period of time.

O'Brien is also able to remember thousands of foreign words in minutes. This shows that the Method of Loci is an easy and powerful way to help learn a foreign language. People of all ages can use it, from children, to adults, to the elderly. Try using this method to learn new vocabulary and you'll be amazed at how much you can remember.

AUTODIDACTICISM


How important is it to have a teacher? Different people will answer this question differently. For some, a good teacher is one of the most important parts of education. For others who prefer to do things on their own, a teacher isn't as important as the ability to teach yourself. This is called self-teaching or autodidacticism. All through history, there have been a number of self-taught people. Some of them have managed to do amazing things.

One famous historical autodidact was Gottfried Leibniz, a German mathematician who grew up and lived in the mid-17th century. When Leibniz was 6 years old, his father, who was a Professor at the University of Leipzig, died and left little Leibniz an entire library of books at home. The boy began reading all those books, learning as much as possible. He taught himself History, Greek, Latin, Science and Mathematics, and eventually would become one of the founders of modern Calculus.



Another great historical autodidact, this time in the 18th century, was Benjamin Franklin, one of the founding fathers of the United States of America. Franklin was trained only as a printer, but through his own efforts, he became an inventor, engineer, businessman, philanthropist, scientist, politician and diplomat. He helped to write the US Constitution, and in later life taught himself a number of languages including French, Spanish, Italian, and Latin.

Autodidacts aren't just historical figures. There are also a number of autodidacts including film directors Steven Spielberg and Stanley Kubrick, as well as the musician David Bowie, and the Austrian composer Arnold Schoenberg. So, as we can see, what really matters is how hard you work to become successful.


So, what did you decide to do next?

Everyday Food Around the World

Enchiladas

One of the most popular dishes in Mexican restaurants are enchiladas. Enchiladas are made with tortillas (flat, thin circles of bread) and different ingredients like meat, cheese, sour cream, vegetables and chilli peppers. The ingredients are wrapped up in tortillas and sauce is poured on top. Some of the most common sauces are: salsa verde (a green sauce made with green chilli peppers), suizas (made with milk), and mole (a traditional recipe with dried red peppers, nuts and chocolate). You can find people selling enchiladas in many Mexican streets, so you can eat them as you walk.



Dutch Pea Soup

The Netherlands is known for its many kinds of soups, but one of the most well-known is the traditional pea soup (snert). Almost every restaurant and café has its own special recipe for this soup. The most common ingredients are peas, herbs, onions, potatoes and sausage. The soup is very thick, and one bowl is definitely enough for a whole meal. The Dutch say that if the soup is good, the spoon will stand on its own in the middle of it. For people who don't have time to go to a restaurant, it makes an excellent takeaway that you can buy from small cafés on the streets or by the canals.



Miso

Miso is a Japanese food made by cooking rice, soya beans, and salt together for a long time until they are very soft. The result is a thick paste or spread. This is added as an ingredient to many Japanese dishes, but most commonly in miso soups. Apart from miso, these soups contain other ingredients, such as fish or mushrooms, depending where they are made in Japan. Japanese people drink the soup right from the bowl and eat the other ingredients with chopsticks (wooden sticks used to pick up food, instead of a fork). This kind of soup is very light and full of vitamins, so it's very good for you.




