When the Internet first came into use, no one really knew just what it was, what it could do, or even what to do with it. However, in a few short years, the possibilities soon became obvious. Suddenly, everyone had a 'hotmail' or 'yahoo' account and letters written on paper became a thing of the past. As if over night, we all knew what a web page was, we were 'chatting' online, and we had access to a world of information, from databases to dictionaries and wikipedia.

Then the unthinkable happened. With the touch of a button, we could tune into not only a world of information, but also the world itself. *Google Earth* is perhaps one of the most incredible technological applications of the Internet, whose importance we haven't yet fully understood.

Think about it. Some 100 years ago, people had just begun to use the telephone. The car and aeroplane were slowly coming into use. For most people, the idea of intercontinental travel and communication was similar to a modern day person considering a day trip to the Moon. Knowledge of the Earth was then limited to the globe sitting on an office desk or the world map put up on the school wall.

But now, everything has changed. Through *Google Earth*, we can actually see our planet from outer space. We can find our exact location through a simple search, quickly travel to the Black sea, pass over the Egyptian pyramids, and look in wonder at the Himalayas - all within a matter of minutes.

Indeed, the world has become much smaller. We are no longer individuals living in isolated countries. We are now a global network of human beings waking up to a future single community. *Google Earth* is just one indication, one symptom of what is to come. It reveals the history of humanity, of our planet, of our earth. It also reveals our future responsibility, our togetherness and the need for commitment to care for this, our home.

Even more exciting is the fact that *Google Earth* has expanded to include a 'window' into the universe. The *Google Universe* application looks into the stars, offering a telescopic look at the various solar systems, constellations and galaxies found in space. Now even the sky is not the limit. Humanity can look even further away.

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi is well known for his belief in non-violence. He proved that a person's ideals can be a weapon more powerful than guns, and that, if the powerless get united, they can bring about change without the use of violence. He used this philosophy in his peaceful struggle to free India from British rule. As a holy man, he was deeply religious but did not believe in any one religion. He tried to teach people to accept all religions as he believed that they taught 'truth', which he said was 'God'. Gandhi helped bring about India's independence but was killed in 1948 by a Hindu fanatic, who accused him of betraying India and the Hindu religion.

B.

Many people regard Jean Monnet, born in Cognac, France, in 1888, as the father of the European Union. He believed that European countries would benefit if they worked together. For this reason, he encouraged cooperation and creative dialogue. He believed that Europe would one day become a community which would share common interests. His greatest contribution towards this goal came after World War II when there was growing tension between Germany and France. Since he was afraid that war would break out once again, Jean Monnet suggested that Germany's and France's coal and steel resources should be controlled by an independent authority. This was the beginning of what was to become a union of nations.



C.

Petra Kelly may not be known to many but she played a very important role in promoting environmentalism. She was born in Bavaria, Germany but was brought up in the USA. After completing her studies, she moved to Germany where she founded the Greens, a political organisation interested in freedom and the environment. She believed that it was the government's responsibility to protect the environment and that not enough was done to do so. Petra's enthusiasm brought about the European green movement. Tragically, she was killed in 1992.



D.

Nadine Gordimer has, throughout her life, fought against injustice. As she was born in South Africa, she knows well what fighting for one's rights is all about. The fact that she is white did not stop her from using her writing skills and her influence as an author to speak out against apartheid. She became famous when she won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1991. For her, meeting people like Nelson Mandela and working with people interested in bringing about equality makes writing meaningful. She uses it to get her message across. She is now involved in a campaign aimed at raising money for HIV/AIDS victims.

Anita Roddick is well-known as the founder of the Body Shop, a company which produces natural cosmetics. 1. ☐ In this relatively short life, she became one of the most successful businesswomen ever, receiving many awards and prizes.

Anita was born in Littlehampton in the UK in 1942. She was the third child to immigrant Italian parents and grew up in a small English seaside town. She described herself as a natural 'outsider'. 2. ☐ In these communities, she experienced how women lived and worked, making creams, soaps and cosmetics from natural products without the use of chemicals. 3. ☐

Back in England after her world trip, she married Gordon Roddick, and together they opened up a hotel and a restaurant. The business wasn't as successful as they expected and Gordon left to go travelling through North and South America, while Anita was left to cope with their two small daughters on her own.

She began producing natural cosmetics in her kitchen and opened her first shop in 1976. 4. ☐ Since then the Body Shop has grown into a huge multi-million pound business with over 2,000 shops in 54 countries serving over 70 million people per year.

Right from the start Ms Roddick used her business to campaign on all kinds of issues: the environment and 'green' issues, animal rights, pacifism and women's rights. None of the cosmetics were tested on animals. She also made sure that all the packaging could be recycled and the bottles could be reused. 5. ☐ Most materials used for her natural cosmetics were bought directly from the producers at a fair price.

6. ☐ Despite this, she will be remembered as one of the leaders of 'ethical', socially responsible business; an idea which means that making money is not the only aim in business life.

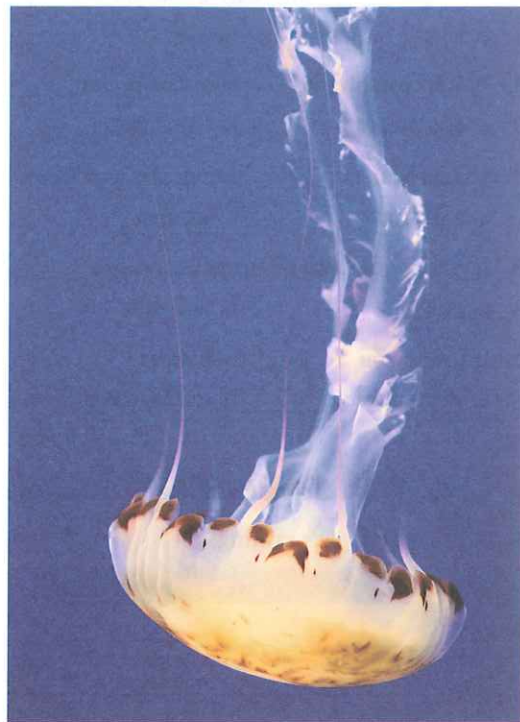

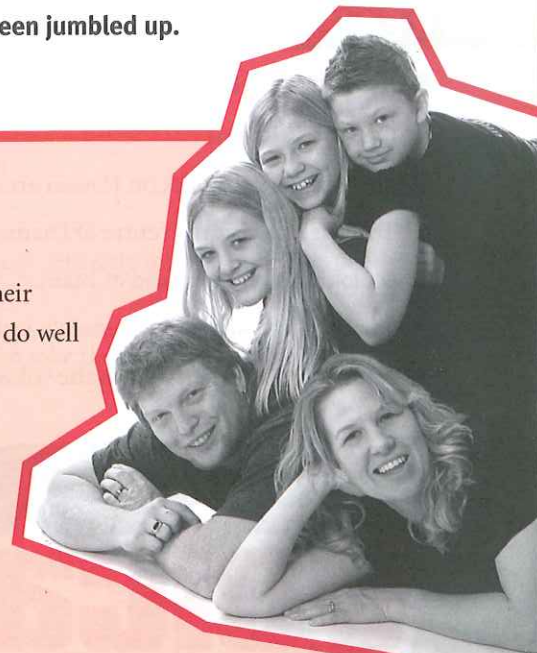

Volcanic HAWAII



The state of Hawaii is a chain of hundreds of islands in the Pacific Ocean which were formed by volcanic explosions that occurred on the ocean floor. There are eight main islands, and the largest one, Hawaii, is also called the 'Big Island.' This keeps people from confusing the name of the island with the name of the whole state. The Big Island was formed by the eruptions of five different volcanoes. Kilauea, on the Big Island, is the most active volcano in the world.

Le'ahi, more commonly known as Diamond Head, is a volcanic crater located on the island of O'ahu. It is an inactive volcano that has an American military base in the centre of it. Diamond Head is a popular spot for visitors to the nearby Waikiki beach, and the state capital of Honolulu. It's also famous because this location is featured in the popular TV show, *Lost*. Molokini is a moon-shaped extinct volcanic crater located in the water near the island of Maui. The crater is an extremely popular spot for scuba divers and snorkellers because of the rare sea life and coral that are located only here. No one actually lives on this island, but many people visit it every day with their boats.



Punalu'u is a very famous beach located on the Big Island. Punalu'u is well known because it actually has black sand. The sand formed from the volcano when lava combined with water and cooled. The sand is protected by the Hawaiian government, and it is against the law to remove it from the island. Kaihalulu is a beach on the coast of Maui that is known for its beautiful red sand. Kaihalulu is one of the few red sand beaches in the world. Its sand is red from the cliffs that overlook it. Iron from the rock colours the sand a bright red. The new Airbus A380 is the largest passenger jet that has ever been built. It can hold more passengers and cargo than any other commercial aeroplane, and most airports actually have to be redesigned in order to provide room for it. Even though the first designs of this giant aeroplane appeared back in 1994, it did not make its first commercial flight until October of 2007, from Singapore to Sydney, Australia, with Singapore Airlines. This long design period allowed the new Airbus jet aeroplane to be perfected technologically as well as practically. It has since been bought by Emirates Airlines as well as Qantas Airlines, and more and more airlines are expressing interest.

The Airbus A380 is nearly 240 feet long and 260 feet wide, from wing to wing. Because of its incredible size, it can seat up to 840 passengers. However, since the seating is divided into first class, business class and economy class, and each class has different seating arrangements, a total of 555 passengers can be seated. In general, more space means broader seats, more personal storage and better head room in all three classes. There are two floors on the Airbus A380, the upper including business and economy class, and the lower including more economy seats as well as first-class seats. Singapore Airlines offers twelve private first-class suites on its A380, each with one full and one

secondary seat, a full-sized bed, desk and personal storage space. Four of these suites are in the form of two 'double' suites featuring a double bed. Qantas Airways' first-class seats feature a long flat bed that converts from the seat but does not have privacy doors. Emirates Airline's fourteen first-class private suites have shared access to two 'shower spas'. First and business class passengers have shared access to a snack bar and lounge with two sofas, in addition to a first-class-only private lounge.

The Airbus A380 is designed to make travelling more comfortable for the passenger. The aeroplane includes more air filters, which refresh the air in the cabin every three minutes helping passengers feel fresher both during and after the flight. Also, the noise in the cabin is lower than any other existing aircraft, which helps reduce tiredness and fatigue.

The Airbus A380 is also environmentally friendly. Its engine emissions are well below international limits, contributing to improved air quality around the airports it serves. It also produces less than 75 grams of carbon dioxide per passenger kilometre contributing to less greenhouse gases in the atmosphere. The A380 also consumes less fuel than most jet aeroplanes, making it not only a bigger, but in many ways, a better aeroplane.
