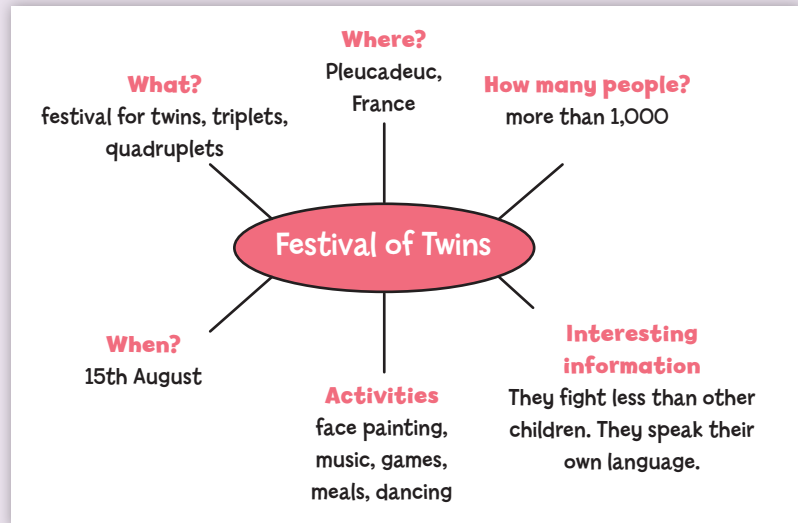
**Remember to think about the following ideas.**
