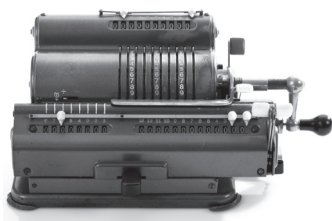


MAKING GUESSES AND GIVING CLUES

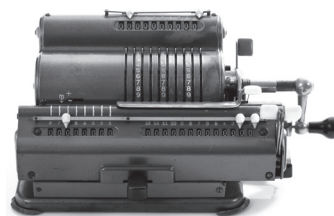
