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# Introduction

## Finding the right words

How many times do we want to say something in another language but we can't find the words?

Learning a language means that you start with a few words and phrases and slowly add to them. It is hardest in the early stages, because there's so much you want to say and you only have a small number

## Topics, words and phrases

In this book, we have chosen the topics which you often cover at the elementary level of an English course (see the previous page for the list of contents). Under each topic, you will find important ('key') words and phrases. If you use these

of words. This is why it is important to try to increase your vocabulary as quickly as possible.

You will find that some words and phrases are more useful to you than others. You need to focus on these and try to learn them so you can use them. You don't have to learn every word or phrase.

words and phrases frequently, you will be able to remember them better. The exercises under each topic usually start with single words, making sure you can spell them correctly, and build towards longer writing activities.

## How to use *Boost Your Vocabulary 2*

You can use this book on your own, for self-study, or in a class with your teacher. It can be used in three ways:

- Choose a topic area of interest to you.
- Read the lists of words and phrases in the topic area.

- Finally, use the Answer key to mark and correct your work.

### 2 To help you with written and spoken work

When you are working on a particular topic in class, use the lists to help you with writing or speaking.

Do the practice exercises at home to help you use the words and phrases in a variety of contexts.

### 3 To revise before a test

Test yourself on particular topics by looking at your translations and saying the English words or phrases.

Try this on your own and with a partner.

## Types of exercise

There are word puzzles, quizzes, surveys and questionnaires; there are exercises which ask you to organize words into groups; and there are opportunities for continuous writing. They aim to help you remember vocabulary and use it correctly.

**Special delivery** is for valuable items which need to arrive before twelve o'clock (midday) the day after posting.

**Recorded delivery** is for important (but not valuable) items which can go either first or second class.

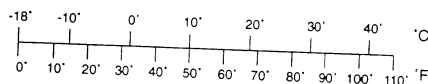

- To make the comparative and superlative of regular one-syllable and some two-syllable adjectives: add -er and -est

- Adjectives which end in -e: add -r and -st for the comparative and superlative

wide	wider	widest

- Adjectives which end in -y

	comparative	superlative
-y $\Rightarrow$ -ier $\Rightarrow$	-iest	
early	earlier	earliest
heavy	heavier	heaviest

- One-syllable adjectives which end in a single consonant: double the consonant before adding -er or -est

	comparative	superlative
big	bigger	biggest
hot	hotter	hottest
wet	wetter	wettest

- When the vowel which comes before the final consonant is not stressed, or when it is spelled with two letters: do not double the consonant

	comparative	superlative
quiet	quieter	quietest
great	greater	greatest

- Do not double y or w at the end of words

- To make an adjective into an adverb: add -ly

- Adjectives which end in -le: drop the e before adding -ly

adjective	adverb
simple	simply
terrible	terribly
