Animals	Description
Alligator	It lives in the wild as well as domesticated livestock.
Anaconda	It is one of the biggest species on these islands.
Andean condor	It is the second longest snake in the world.
Bald eagle	It is the largest rodent in the world.
Beaver	It hasn't got a dorsal fin. It returns to its birthplace every 3 years. It is a very big mammal.
Bison	It is omnivorous. It has got sharp teeth in both jaws.
Cayman	It is the largest flying bird in South America. It weighs around 15 kg.
Capybara	It is almost 1 metre long. The largest is the black variety.
Coatimundi	It looks like a pig with a kind of short trunk and hoofed toes.
Coyote	It is related to the racoon family. It is usually 127 cm long.
Giant Galapagos tortoise	It is the US national symbol. It has a white head and tail and a dark brown body and wings.
Grizzly bear	It is a subspecies of the brown bear found in North America.
Llama	It is the largest mammal in North America. It has a shoulder hump.
Moose	It is the largest of the deer family. It is around 1.80 m tall and 2.40 m long.
Piranha	It is smaller than the grey wolf. It is a carnivore. Its diet includes snakes, fish, rodents and birds.
Racoon	It has four big incisors. It lives in streams, ponds, and lakes. It builds dams.
Rattle snake	It is related to the coatimundi family. It is usually nocturnal.
