Open at weekends from 9 to 7 in the evening.

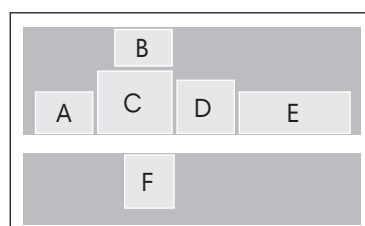
