## The History of the Theater

The first theater was in Ancient Greece. Theaters then were outside and they were in the shape of a semi-circle. Some theaters were very big, with space for more than 15,000 people.

The first actor was named Thespis. Before Thespis there weren't any actors, there were only storytellers. Thespis won an acting competition in Ancient Greece, and he became very famous. Only men and boys were actors.

There were two types of plays in Ancient Greece — comedies and tragedies. Comedies were funny, and tragedies were sad. Actors in comedies wore happy masks and light clothes. Actors in tragedies wore sad masks and dark clothes.
