People are talking about a strange story. It's called *The Egyptian Mystery* and it's about a secret code. The code is on the wall of the Sphinx in Egypt. People want to understand what it means. When they know the code, they know where to find the magic ring.

Detective Nick writes the code on his Secret Agent note pad.

'Hang on a minute!' he shouts.

Superdog is sleeping, but he jumps up when he hears Detective Nick.

'Do you remember the book I've got, Superdog? It's called *Understanding Mysteries*. I think there's something there about Egyptian codes.' Detective Nick goes up to his attic and finds the book. He opens it at page 76 (his favourite number!) and reads the first words:

To find the mystery on the wall,

Use the mirror in the hall.

'That's it!' he says. 'We use a mirror to read the code. We read the words from right to left – not from left to right! It's easy!'

Detective Nick holds his mirror against the notepad and reads out the words:

Touch this wall and say 'riddle-me-ree'

The magic ring you will see.

'That's it!' shouts Nick again. 'We've got the code! Come on. Egypt, here we come!'
